Other News:

• National Patient Safety Alert. A reminder that just before the Christmas break a National Patient Safety Alert was issued by NHS England and the NHS Improvement patient safety team. The safety alert is for all organisations supplying NHS-funded hearing aids to babies, children or adults. The alert about the risk of harm to babies and children from coin/button batteries in hearing aids and other hearing devices, includes information from the Child Accident Prevention Trust that suggests around two children per year in the UK die from coin/button battery ingestion, but the actual numbers seriously injured or requiring hospital treatment are unknown. The implementation of actions from the patient safety alert are to be completed by 11th September and should be co-ordinated by the head of audiology, or equivalent role, with oversight by an executive leader. - Research Grant available. The Ida Institute has announced that the Ida Institute Research
 Committee is now accepting proposals for projects investigating outcomes of the use of Ida
 tools for our 2020 Research Grant. Funding will be awarded to projects that develop
 evidence related to Ida Institute methods and tools and aim to demonstrate the effects of
 person-centred care in hearing rehabilitation. Up to \$10,000 USD is available. More details
