Research Grant available. The Ida Institute has announced that their Research Committee is now accepting proposals for projects investigating outcomes of the use of Ida tools for our 2020 Research Grant. Funding will be awarded to projects that develop evidence related to Ida Institute methods and tools and aim to demonstrate the effects of person-centred care in hearing rehabilitation. Up to \$10,000 USD is available. More details can be found here. The eyes to measure hearing? An article in Neuroscience News features some research work from the University of Oregon which shows that eye-tracking and pupil dilation may be a new way to measure a person's hearing ability. Two Neuroscientists have published a freely accessible paper in the Journal of the Association for Research in Otolaryngology about their work using eye-tracking technology simultaneously as they conducted traditional hearing exams with 31 adults in a quiet room.
