Mini-roundup Wednesday 25 March

Dear ENT UK member,

We are very pleased to announce that Public Health England (PHE) has accepted the need for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to be used in all ENT-related procedures during the COVID-19 pandemic, and has agreed to change their list of Aerosol-Generating Procedures (AGPs) to reflect this. PHE has also agreed to ENT UK's PPE request for all patient contact for examination and procedures, not just for suspected or confirmed COVID-19.

Please be aware that, due to the rapidly evolving nature of the situation, these versions are currently the most up-to-date advice and therefore supersede any previously issued guidance which may be circulating. ENT UK is aware that there will be hospital/department variation on how our guidance is implemented. It is up to each individual Trust to decide how the guidance is administered and ENT UK is unable to influence this.
