The Cochlear Implant Champion Scheme A Mentor's Perspective

Cochlear implants can change lives; we are the gatekeepers.

There are more gates and hurdles on the road to a cochlear implant (CI) than the referral alone - but if they are not offered the referral, a patient is denied the opportunity to travel the road. Audiologists and Hearing Therapists can identify CI candidates, then counsel, motivate and empower them to consider CI referrals better than anyone.

Champions and Mentors
The national CI Champion Scheme initiative was launched in 2019 by the British Cochlear Implant Group (BCIG) and the British Academy of Audiology (BAA) jointly. For those who are unfamiliar with the scheme, it aims for all CI eligible candidates to be identified, well-informed about CI and offered a timely CI referral using a named

CI champion in each Audiology department. The other component to the scheme is a named CI mentor from each implant centre to support the referring sites' champions in their region.

This article is a mentor's account of the CI Champion Scheme process undertaken at the adult Midlands Hearing Implant Programme (MHIP) and is written from a CI mentor's perspective. The following contains my own interpretation and suggestions based on the learnings so far.

What does the data say?

Trends in total adult CI referrals into MHIP were heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and 2021 (figure 1). Excluding those two calendar years, we can compare post-pandemic external

referrals into MHIP by the top 11 referring sites in 2022 and year-to-date 2023 to pre-pandemic (and pre-Champion Scheme) 2019 levels (figure 2).

The Midlands adult CI champions (figure 2, labelled and outlined in green) can say with pride that they are increasing their sites' referrals: at the time of writing in May 2023, two champion sites (H and K in the figure) have referred more in the first five months of this year than they did in the entirety of 2022.

Breaking down the data by champion sites versus non-champion sites (figure 3), illustrates why the total number of referrals into MHIP in 2022 was not significantly higher than in pre-pandemic 2019. The total 48% increase in referrals by engaged champion sites was mitigated by a total decrease of 32% in referrals from sites, with limited engagement to the scheme.

Furthermore, CI referrals from Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) into our

After investing over two years into the CI Champion Scheme, the question remained: Why hadn't adult CI referrals increased above pre-pandemic levels? (figure 1)

DO YOU STRUGGLE TO KNOW WHO TO REFER? DO YOU FORGET THE CRITERIA?

A new resource has been developed! This tool is designed as a guide for referring clinicians who see adult patients in the UK. It will show when an audiogram falls within the basic referral criteria, but also gives additional guidance on when a speech test would be a particularly useful addition in assessing candidacy prior to referral. This is particularly relevant for borderline cases.

It also considers when someone with a mixed hearing loss may be suitable for CI vs when a bone anchored device may be better. It also has a handy set of frequently asked questions to accompany it. This is a valuable resource.

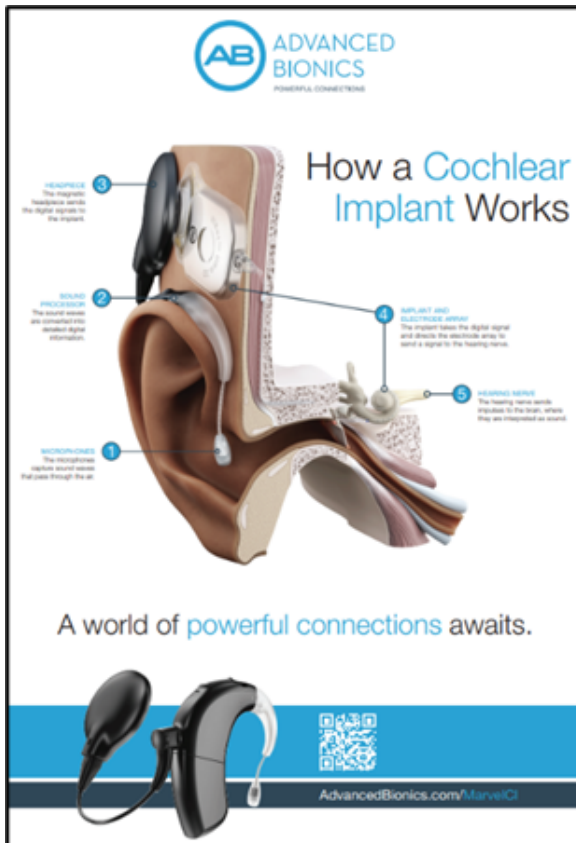

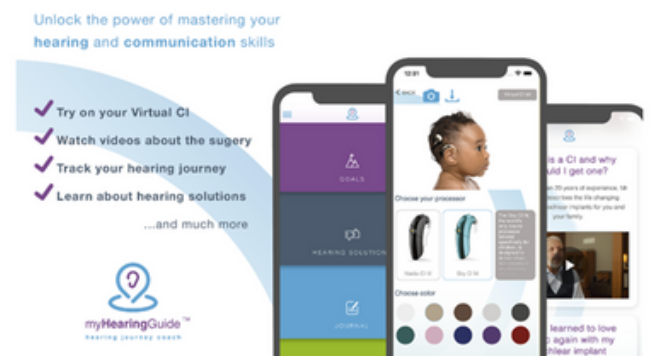
UPDATE: myHearingGuide App

Referral Research

We asked Dr Anne Small about Referral Research. Anne reports: 'We know that only a small proportion of adults who would benefit from a cochlear implant ever end up getting one, and this proportion is even smaller within our minority communities. Some exciting research is underway at the University of Cambridge, funded by Cochlear, investigating facilitators to cochlear implantation within the Pakistani and Bangladeshi communities. Let's hope this leads to many more implants for those who need them most.' Future updates in due course...
